Andrew Harvey



Andrew (Andy) Harvey entered active service in the U.S. Army in 1986 as an Armor Officer. He became a West European Foreign Area Officer in 1994 and served as a Political-Military Intelligence officer on the Army staff at the Pentagon, as an Instructor at the Command and General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, and as Intel Branch Chief in the G2 U.S. Army Europe. His last assignment was as the Political-Military Intelligence Officer for the C9 staff section (Civil Affairs) of Multinational Corps Iraq at Camp Victory Baghdad from January to December 2006. He received a Bachelors of Arts degree in Political Science and a Masters degree in International Relations from Appalachian State University. Currently, he is a Political Science PhD student at the University of Kansas working on his dissertation on the European Union's development of defense capability. Harvey is also currently working again in the Department of Joint and Multinational Operations CGSC Ft. Leavenworth. He is scheduled to retire in February 2008.

Major Harvey has received numerous awards and decorations, including The Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Army Parachute Badge and the Army Staff Identification Badge.

He resides in Weston, Missouri with his wife of 21 years, Denise Harvey, and their three sons: Stephen, Matthew and Daniel (all Eagle Scouts).
